Lord Hill has spent half his career in business and half at the highest levels of government, including four years at 10 Downing Street. As a Minister at the Department for Education, Lord Hill led the biggest reform of British education for a generation: the Government's programme establishing Free Schools and Academies. Most recently, Lord Hill worked as the Government's most senior representative in the House of Lords, where he was responsible for delivering the Coalition's legislative programme.
